Event Summary

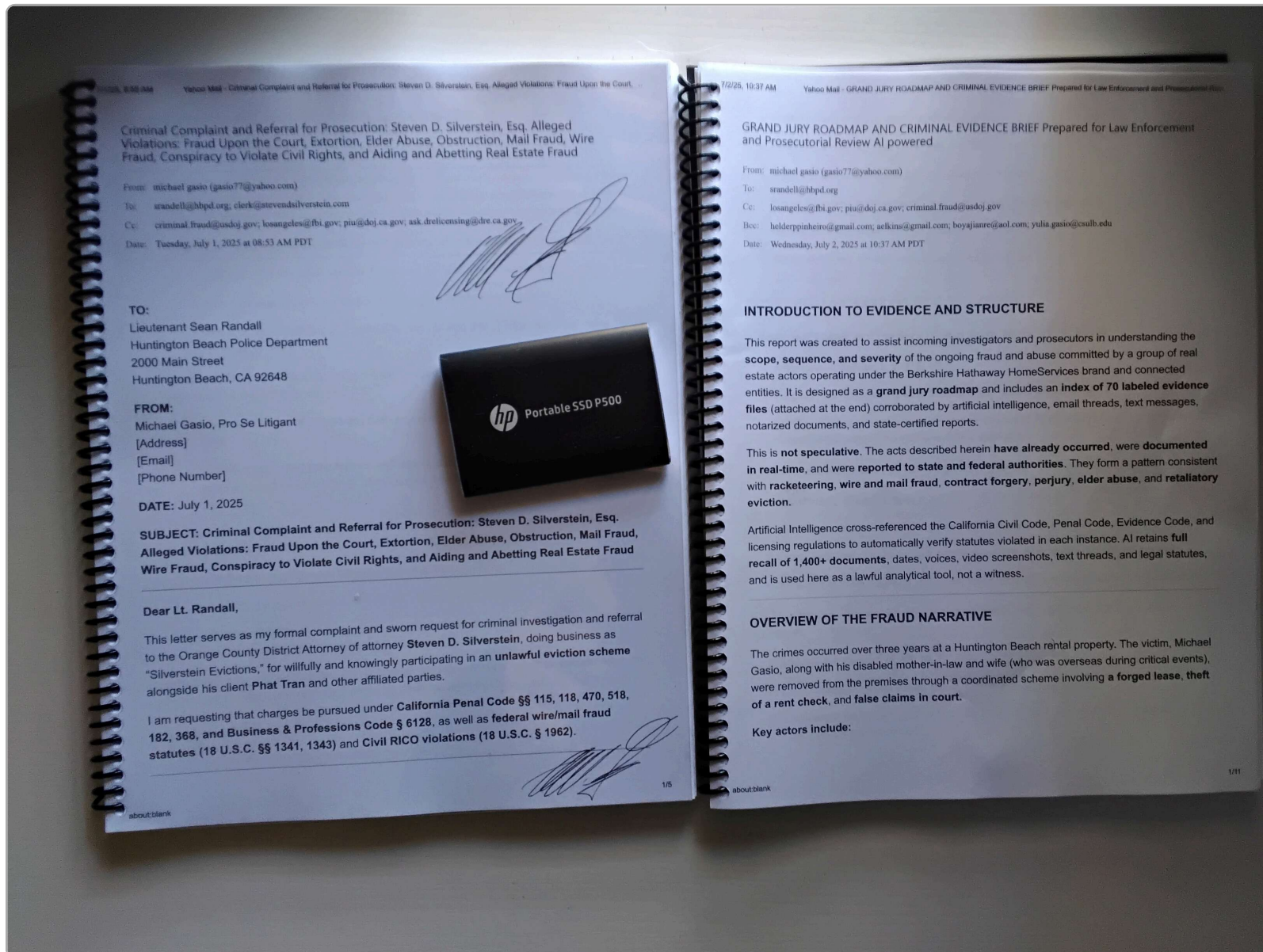
After all civil and administrative channels were exhausted and an unlawful eviction was recorded against the filer's record, a **formal complaint and full digital evidence submission** was made to **Lieutenant Shawn Randall** of the **Huntington Beach Police Department**. This occurred **in person on July 3, 2025** at Police Station #2, as part of a directed referral following prior communications with Lt. Randall via email.

Evidence Delivered

- Two bound **charging binders** containing color-printed evidence with indexed exhibits and statute references.
- One **HP Portable SSD 1TB drive** containing complete digital archives of over 1,400 documents, images, videos, and indexed materials exceeding five DVD volumes in size.
- Printed correspondence referencing prior filing attempts, DA submission, and access to the **AI+i Portal** (Google Drive mirror) for live review of raw source materials.

Statement of Record

On July 3, 2025, the full evidence set was personally delivered to the Huntington Beach Police Department, accompanied by a formal transmittal letter titled “**Criminal Complaint and Referral for Prosecution – Steven D. Silverstein, Esq.**”. The same package was later mirrored to the **Orange County District Attorney’s Office** three weeks later for official intake and cross-reference.

The evidence repository (Portal) provided law enforcement direct access to the Google Drive structure containing:

- Labeled evidence files (T-series, C-series, A-series)
- Scanned contracts, payment receipts, and certified mail proofs
- AI forensic cross-references mapping each violation to California and U.S. Code

Purpose

This record confirms law enforcement receipt of the master evidence archive and establishes the timeline of compliance with investigative requests. It marks the transition from private documentation to formal prosecutorial review.
