### Overview

During the pre-trial period, **Michael Andrew Gasio** acted **Pro Se** and reconstructed the \$8,000 brief refused by former attorney **Richard Rosiak**. The new compilation incorporated certified payments, correspondence, and contract exhibits forming the first **two white binders** of five presented in every court session. This reconstruction established the baseline record for the fraud and retaliation claims against **Dr. Phat Tran** and **Attorney Steven D. Silverstein**.

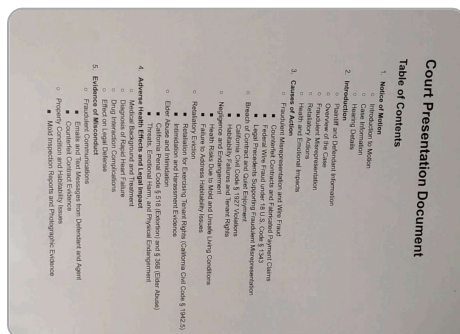

**Introduction to Motion**

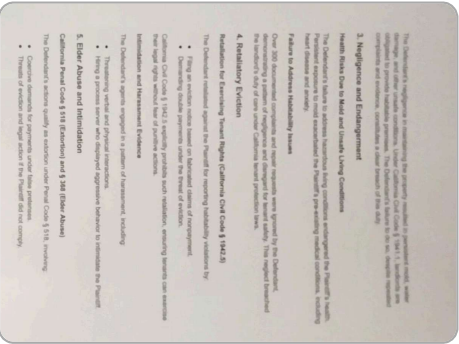

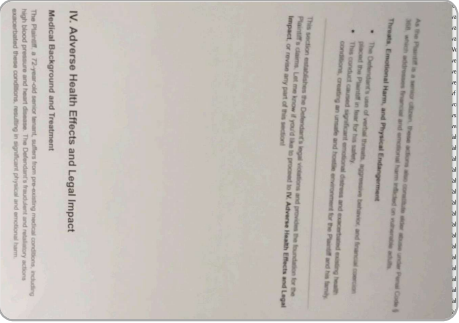
T43E – Adverse Health Effects and Legal Impact



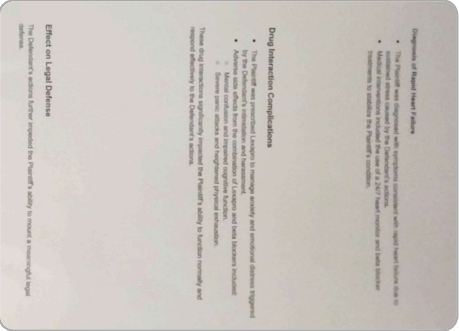

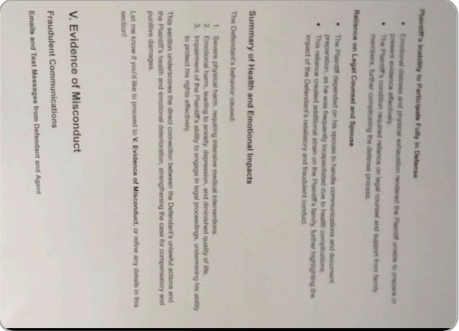

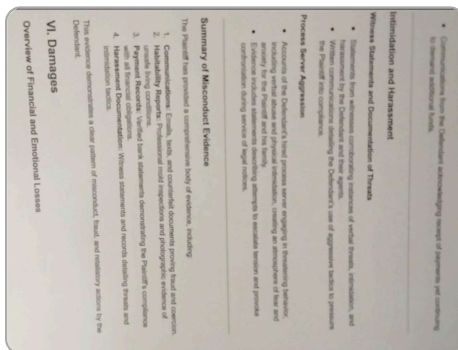
