Subject: Formal Demand for Compliance and Release of Documents

Dear Mr. Rosiak,

This letter serves as a formal demand for the immediate release of all documents, receipts, and records related to your legal representation of my case. Our agreement for \$8,500 was primarily for labor, with the explicit understanding that you would prepare my court-ready documents for filing. You were well aware that I was suing my landlord as the defendant to recover \$7,000 in unlawfully collected gardening fees, which had not been applied to labor.

As you know, I am on Social Security and was unable to secure alternative legal representation in a timely manner. Your failure to fulfill your obligations has placed me in an unconscionable position, forcing me to continue pro se despite the substantial evidence I provided regarding fraud and misconduct. You were fully aware that my agreement with you was for document preparation only and that I would be handling the litigation myself. Given my background—including having represented teachers at both the state and federal level in bargaining and my coursework in penal law, evidence law, and business law (all completed with an A grade)—I was more than capable of handling my case if you had fulfilled your obligations.

Your failure to do so will be scrutinized not only in court but also by other legal professionals who will review your handling of this matter. Consider this your final notice to comply with my lawful requests immediately.
